To develop chronological understanding of key events and time periods in British history from the Stone Age to the Normans	Introduction Briefly explain the concept of a timeline and explain to children what will happen in this activity i.e. if children answer questions correctly they can come up and play the role of one of the people on the timeline. Session activities	Children will be able to answer questions about the different time periods and will develop their chronological understanding of key events and time periods in British History from the Stone Age to the Normans.
	Children will listen to hear information about the different time periods from the Paleolithic Age to the time of the Normans. They will answer questions as we go and different children will be asked to come up and play the part of people from these different time periods.
